**VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT TO RESIGN FROM
JUDICIAL OFFICE IN LIEU OF DISCIPLINARY ACTION**

This Agreement is being entered into by the undersigned parties pursuant to Section 33.032(h) of the Texas Government Code.

WHEREAS at all times relevant hereto, the Honorable Ann Remley was the Municipal Court Judge for the City of Malakoff, Henderson County, Texas, and

WHEREAS on March 3, 2006, a complaint was filed with the Commission by the Police Chief of Malakoff, Texas, alleging that Judge Remley failed to properly handle traffic cases and fees collected by her court, and

WHEREAS Judge Remley resigned from office on or about April 10, 2006, and

WHEREAS no Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law have been made in connection with the above-referenced matters, and

WHEREAS the parties agree that the allegations of judicial misconduct, if found to be true, could result in further disciplinary action against Judge Remley, and

WHEREAS the parties to this Agreement are desirous of resolving these matters without the time and expense of further disciplinary proceedings.

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED that Judge Remley, upon the signing of this Agreement, agrees that she has officially and formally resigned her judicial office and is entering into this agreement to resolve the above-referenced matter in lieu of disciplinary action by the Commission, pursuant to Section 33.032(h) of the Texas Government Code. The Commission agrees that it shall pursue no further disciplinary proceedings against Judge Remley in connection with the above-referenced matter.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that, upon the Commission's approval of this Agreement, Judge Remley shall not be disqualified from future judicial service; sitting or serving as a judge in the State of Texas in the future; or standing for election or appointment to judicial office in the State of Texas.


IT IS FURTHER AGREED that any violation of this Agreement by Judge Remley would constitute willful or persistent conduct that is clearly inconsistent with the proper performance of her duties or casts public discredit upon the judiciary or administration of justice in violation of Art. 5, §1-a(6)A of the Texas Constitution, and Section 33.001(b) of the Texas Government Code.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the Commission may enforce this Agreement through any legal process necessary, including injunctive relief; that Travis County, Texas, shall be the proper venue for any dispute between the parties or proceeding relating to this Agreement; and that Judge Remley, individually, shall bear the expense, cost, and any reasonable and necessary attorneys' fees in the event any dispute arising under this Agreement is decided against her by any court or tribunal.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that Judge Remley, by her execution of this voluntary agreement, does not admit guilt, fault or liability regarding the matters contained in the complaints referenced above.

AGREED TO AND ACCEPTED upon its execution by the parties.

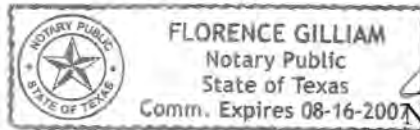
